ABOUT OUR MORNING SPEAKERS



Duncan O'Connor is a planning lawyer and partner in the Infrastructure Planning and Parliamentary team at TLT. He advises public and private sector promoters on securing planning consents for major projects, particularly under the Planning Act and Transport and Works Act. Duncan provides strategic and technical advice on all aspects of the planning process, including environmental impact assessment, compulsory acquisition, order drafting and negotiating agreements with affected parties. He leads large teams of specialist lawyers to guide clients through the planning process, including representing them at hearings and inquiries. Duncan's focus is the transport sector and he has advised on some of the largest and most complex projects in the UK including East West Rail, Silvertown tunnel and Heathrow airport third runway.



Adam Anyszewski is one of co-founders and CPO at Continuum Industries, whose work spans over anything to do with the company's core product, Optioneer, and its implementation and roll-out with customer organisations. Coming from an Electrical and Mechanical Engineering educational background (MEng @ University of Edinburgh, 2018), Adam has entered infrastructure development space together with Continuum Industries, initially looking at railway infrastructure. Over time the company re-focused its efforts towards water resilience infrastructure, and eventually, supporting the development of offshore grids, onshore transmission, renewable energy projects and hydrogen networks. As the product and services developed, Adam's interests grew beyond engineering aspects of project development and spatial planning, including considerations around streamlining consent and land management. Although not an expert in 'land' as such, Adam brings in an interesting perspective built around a holistic, multi-disciplinary approach to system planning and future network development. He is looking forward to connecting with experts in the field, while sharing his own experiences from building up a digital product that was used to design over 80,000km of projects across 15+ countries.

Tom will draw on practical lessons from these high-profile schemes, highlighting the importance of collaboration with landowners and the pivotal role of land referencing in successful project outcomes.

He has led land referencing teams delivering some of the highest profile projects the industry has been challenged with, including HS2, Heathrow Expansion, Dublin MetroLink, Tideway Tunnel, Crossrail, Thameslink and the Channel Tunnel Rail Link (HS1) as well as Silvertown Tunnel, M4 J3-12, Manston and Luton Airports, National Grid interconnector projects, West Coast Route Modification; Nottingham Tram; Edinburgh's and Glasgow's Tram and Airport Rail Link schemes and many other projects.

Ashley has written and presented on the technical aspects of land referencing and is co-author of the land referencing sections of the National Infrastructure Planning Handbook 2022. He is also Vice President – Professional of the Royal Geographical Society.

COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT

The SoLR Standards and Ethics Committee supports and promotes the land referencing profession. It seems reasonable that, as an industry authority on land referencing, SoLR should establish accepted definitions that clearly describe our work. The Standards Sub-Committee will consider what standards might be usefully required and attempt to define, maintain and share these. It will not however involve itself in the determination of appropriate methodologies to achieve these standards as these are a matter for individual practitioners and land referencing firms.

This Committee, chaired by Ashley Parry Jones, has been busy developing some of the required structures SoLR requires to conduct its business in a robust and transparent manner.

The Committee's work also extends to the development of industry consultation responses on behalf of SoLR to ensure our specialist, professional voice is heard in our industry. However the Committee's main activity is the development of industry standards. This work is ongoing and had focussed on the conceptual standards applicable to all land referencing work.

These conceptual standards will be complemented with jurisdictional standards that will capture best practices applicable regionally under the processes required in England, Wales, Scotland, N Ireland and the Republic of Ireland.

The Standards & Ethics Committee is always seeking support, especially for the development of regionally applicable standards.





A TUPE transfer then brought Martin to National Highways, before he seized the opportunity to join Skanska's M42 Junction 6 improvements team .
















EVENING RECEPTION
